Response: Theoretically, the bid price for new install would go down because the removal is no longer included in the pay item. The cost of removal is now all in Section 110 and no longer a

District staff has reviewed the subject procedure and have the following to offer at this time. Should you have any questions, please let me know. (Please note: This is the same Resolution as it is for 16-08457. It is not a mix up. The same resolution applied to both of the trackers)

Assignment Resolution: Since the Specification is conceptually being revised to include concrete removal under Clearing and Grubbing, which typically has units of LS or Acres, how will SY concrete be quantified and overruns be paid for? Additionally, Clearing and Grubbing is a plan quantity item. We often have overruns on concrete.

Response:

Sidewalk, curb elements, ditch pavement, and rigid concrete pavement will be measured (SY) and paid based on plan area/projected horizontal plain. Please see Program Management Bulletin 16-06.

5201201, 5210800, 5221000, 52401000 are proposing to make the removal of existing items fall under the clearing and grubbing pay item which is a "lump sum" item. How will the contractors be compensated when we find over runs to any of these items. The removal of concrete sidewalk, curb and gutter, ditch pavement, etc.. are some of the most overrun items we use. More than not we find additional areas for all of these items that are removed and replaced. Placing the removal under the clearing and grubbing item will create issues with payments. Tracking quantities is not an issue because your removal sy's should match your new sy's (in most cases). Need to leave removal under the cost of the new items.

Response: Sidewalk, curb elements, ditch pavement, and rigid concrete pavement will be measured (SY) and paid based on plan area/projected horizontal plain. Please see Program Management Bulletin 16-06.
