

MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC – TEMPORARY PEDESTRIAN ACCESS

(REV 02-06-26)

ARTICLE 102-9 is expanded by the following:

102-9.19 Temporary Pedestrian Access: Use Temporary Pedestrian Access and Temporary Portable Curb Ramp devices listed on the APL. Install devices in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations at locations shown in plans. Install handrails at ramp runs with rise greater than 6", at walking surface locations with drop-offs greater than 10" from walking surface to the ground and closer than 2 feet from the edge of the access, or where required by ADA standards. Restore existing surfaces upon removal of devices.

ARTICLE 102-11 is expanded by the following:

102-11.29 Temporary Pedestrian Access: The quantity to be paid for will be paid as the square feet of temporary pedestrian access and temporary portable curb ramps per day. No separate payment will be made for temporary pedestrian access handrails.

SUBARTICLE 102-13.27 is deleted and the following substituted:

102-13.27 Temporary Pedestrian Access: Price and payment will be full compensation for furnishing, installing, and removing all materials required for a complete installation, including handrails, connectors, and ground anchors.

ARTICLE 102-13 is expanded by the following:

102-13.28 Payment Items: Payment will be made under:

TEMPORARY TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE MATERIALS – TEMPORARY PEDESTRIAN ACCESS

SECTION 990 is expanded by the following:

990-18 Temporary Pedestrian Access.

990-18.1 General: All Temporary Pedestrian Access devices shall be listed on the Department's Approved Product List (APL). Manufacturers seeking evaluation of their product shall submit an application in accordance with Section 6 and include the documentation identified in the Table below:

Documentation	Requirements (edit as needed for specific products)
Product Photo	Provide product photos that display the significant features of the product. Provide photos for all manufacturer supplied installation materials.
Technical Data Sheet	Provide product literature that uniquely identifies the product and includes product specifications, storage instructions, and recommended installation materials and equipment as applicable.

Table 990-4 Temporary Pedestrian Access	
Documentation	Requirements (edit as needed for specific products)
Product Label and Packaging	Provide label and packaging photos for each component of the product system. Provide label and packaging photos for all manufacturer supplied installation materials.
Installation Instructions, Manufacturer's Instructions	Manufacturer's instructions must include surface preparation details, anchoring instructions, inspection details, maintenance or repair instructions, as well as removal and/or restoration instructions.

990-18.2 Temporary Pedestrian Access- ADA Requirements: All temporary access surfaces and temporary portable curb ramps must provide an ADA compliant, firm, stable, and slip-resistant surface for pedestrian traffic. ADA compliant handrails must be available for all locations. Handrails must provide a continuous smooth surface for hand trailing, with no opportunities for abrasion, splintering, or pinch points.

990-18.3 Temporary Pedestrian Access Surfaces:

Products must meet the following requirements:

1. Minimum width of 36 inches unobstructed clear width.
2. Running slope of 1:12 or less at all locations along the access relative to existing grade.
3. Maximum cross slope of 1:48.

990-18.4 Temporary Portable Curb Ramp: Temporary portable curb ramps can be a standalone ramp, or a ramp system comprised of a ramp and platform. Temporary portable curb ramps must meet the following:

1. Minimum width of 48 inches unobstructed clear width.
2. Running slope of 1:12 or less at all locations along the ramp
3. Maximum cross slope of 1:48.
4. Eight inches continuous detectable edging above walking surface.
5. Capable of installing handrails to a minimum height of 32 inches. Handrails must provide a continuous smooth surface for hand trailing, with no opportunities for abrasion, splintering, or pinch points.
