

Map US Bicycle Route 90 Florida Segment
















































Dear Secretary Prasad:

I am writing you in support of the applications I understand the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will soon be submitting to the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) to establish US Bicycle Routes in Florida. The application to establish US Bicycle Route 90 is of primary interest to the Capital Region Transportation Planning Agency (CRTPA) since the proposed route will cross Florida's Capital Region.

In conversations with your staff, I understand that FDOT can apply for future changes to the initial routing or add Alternate Routes such as has occurred over the history of the US Highway System. An Alternate US Bicycle Route 90 over the scenic Tallahassee-St. Marks Historic Railroad State Trail is an example of how an Alternate route could be used to showcase a National Recreational Trail.

The schedule for applying for these routes did not fit the schedule for the CRTPA Board to adopt a formal Resolution of Support but I will advise the Board of the steps you are taking. Since the proposed route for US Bicycle Route 90 will be entirely under state facilities, no formal action by the Board is required to establish the initial route. The most important achievement of the step FDOT is now taking is to put US Bicycle Routes "on the map" in Florida.

Best wishes for the approval of US Bicycle Route 90 and US Bicycle Route 1 in Florida by AASHTO in November. We look forward to working with you and your staff in promoting the route in our region.
