






#### **Vital Few**

- Embracing innovation in every aspect of our agency









- New mobility vision embrace new modes, technologies and innovation















## **M-CORES Program**

- SB7068 signed into law in May 2019
- Multimodal and multiuse regional corridors
- Task Force Final Report –
  October 1, 2020
- Construction begins December 31, 2022
- Corridors open to traffic December 31, 2030
