

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

This document contains answers to common questions, along with some tips and tricks that we have found useful and presented here as questions.

### **How do I know if the version I have of the Structures Manual is the most current?**

Please check the [Structures Manual Website](#) regularly for any updates to the Manual. You should also regularly check the [Structures Design Office Website](#) for any Structures Design Bulletins or other important announcements. You can also sign up for the [FDOT Contact Mailer](#) to receive email notices about publications or training opportunities specific to your areas of interest.

### **How do I know what has changed in the 2024 Structures Manual?**

Areas in the manual that have changed from the previous year are marked with a change bar (a bold line in the margin next to the modified text). If an item was deleted from the manual there will be no change bar associated with the modification; however, the change will be noted in the revision history for the section. For a list of the sections in the Volume which have changed, followed by a brief description of the change, go to the Revision History section of the PDF. To compare the new content to previous versions, you may view older archived versions of the Structures Manual by visiting the [Archived Publications page](#) of the Structures Design Office Website.

### **I have Adobe Acrobat. Can I edit the pdf files of the Structures Manual?**

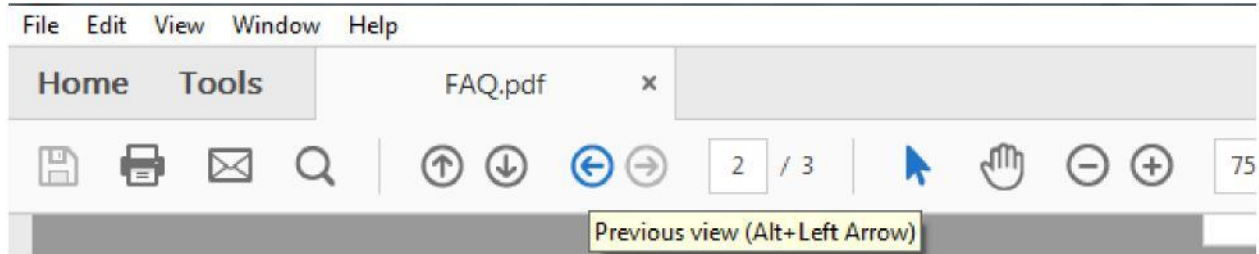
Yes, you can. Feel free to add personal notes or add content from new Structures Design Bulletins directly into the pdf files that are downloaded to your computer. Please note that while it is possible for those with PDF editing software to download and modify the **Structures Manual** and the Appendices, the only recognized official versions are the documents provided on the [Structures Design Office Internet Website](#).

### **How can I get a link to open a new window?**

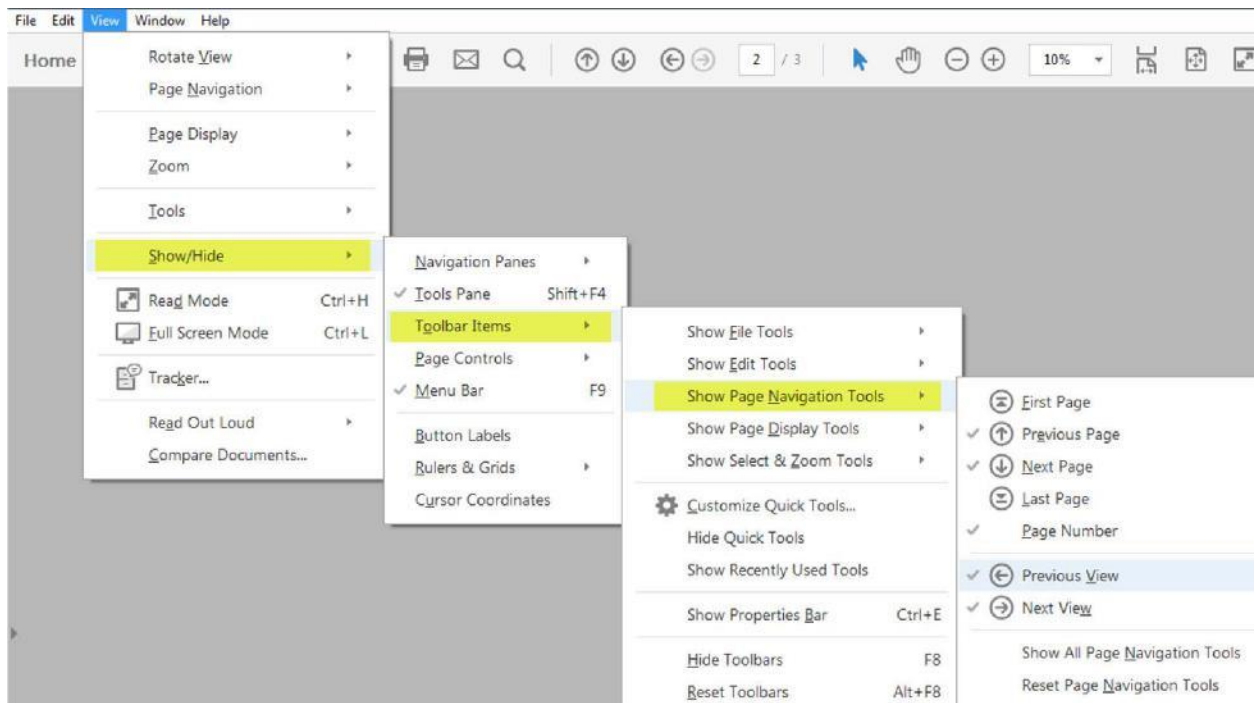
If you'd like to keep your current document open and have a link open a new Adobe Reader window, just hold down the <Ctrl> button when clicking on a link.

## How can I get back to the section I was reading previously after I've clicked on a link?

Adobe Acrobat Reader DC provides both “previous view” and “next view” buttons.



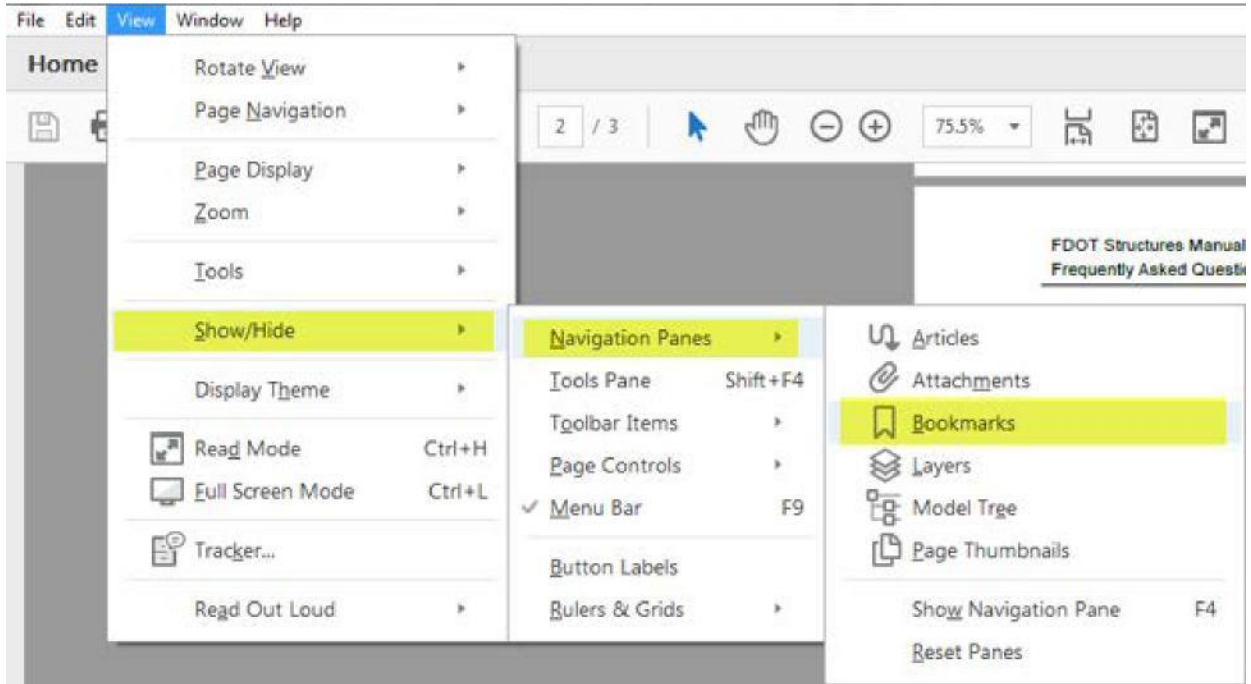
If you don't have these buttons activated, you can access them by selecting View>Show/Hide>Toolbar Items>Show Page Navigation Tools and selecting the check marks beside Previous View and Next View.



Once these buttons are activated, you can use them to help navigate through the Manual.

## What's the best way to find a specific topic or section in the Structures Manual?

The easiest way to navigate within the PDF is by expanding the Bookmarks provided to the left of the page. If the Bookmark tab is not already open when the Structures Manual pdf opens, you can activate it by clicking View>Navigation Panels>Bookmarks.
