With this letter and pursuant to the authority delegated to the Florida Department of Transportation by the Governor, I approve the attached STIP Administrative Modification 09-23 for the Port of Miami Tunnel & Access Improvement Project.

In compliance with Title 23 CFR 450.22, I certify that the changes to the STIP were developed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Federal Transportation Statutes.

On June 16, 2008, the STIP was amended via STIP Amendment No. 08-09a to add the Port of Miami Tunnel & Access Improvement Project (POMT).

The STIP Amendment for this project fell outside the normal scope and context of traditional STIP Amendments because of the long duration of the project and the unique procurement process being used. This project will be implemented on an expedited basis using a long-term public private partnership concessionaire agreement under which availability payments will be paid to the concessionaire for a period of 35 years, which is well beyond the traditional four years of the federal STIP and TIP documents.

The purpose of the amendment was to provide disclosure of the intent to federalize this project to enable the concessionaire to qualify for eligibility to apply for credit assistance under the provisions of the Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act of 1998 (TIFIA). Projects receiving TIFIA credit assistance must meet the same federal requirements under Title 23 U.S.C. and related federal regulations as any project receiving Title 23 U.S.C. federal grant funding. At that time the Department did not contemplate the use of any Title 23 grant funds to finance the project.

Unfortunately, the economic downturn which began in the latter part of 2008 severely impacted the credit markets and resulted in the proposed concessionaire being unable to reach a financial closing with the Department. The project was placed on hold for a time until financial conditions improved.

On June 2, 2009, the Department issued a press release indicating an agreement had been reached with the proposed concessionaire on the commercial issues for the POMT. Financial closing is expected in September, 2009.

The purpose of this administrative modification is to disclose the use of federal National Highway System funds as part of the financing for this project, in addition to state and local funds. Since the original STIP amendment was approved in June, 2008, the Department has reduced the amount of state funds and added federal funds in a like amount. \$211 million in federal National Highway System funds are now programmed on this project.

There have been no other changes to the scope or overall cost of this project.

The purpose of this letter is to request that you approve an administrative amendment to the adopted Miami-Dade MPO FY 2009 TIP, to disclose additional federal funding as shown in the FY 2010 TIP. As you are aware, the FY 2010 TIP, which was approved by your board on May 28, 2009, will not become effective until October 1, 2009. Until then, the FY 2009 TIP will be used by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for authorization of funds. This action will reconcile the differences between the two documents, and provide the most accurate and up-to-date project information as outlined in the attached spreadsheet.

The requested amendment is needed so that the project can be obligated before the beginning of the new federal fiscal year, on October 1, 2009. Provision for this process is outlined in the Federal Aid Technical bulletin dated June 10, 2004 and the MPO Management Handbook (page 5-25).
